Identify the information that you'd like to share with your learners. What interests you about the topic? What do you think your learners might already know about it?


Based on the kinds of resources and activities you've already seen in the main course, what course elements might work well for sharing information with your learners in your own course?

Add resources and activities to your course.



Create a label, page or book.





Drag and drop files, or create a folder.



Add a block or URL.

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Create a forum, glossary or choice.

INVITE LEARNERS*

Share a link to your course in the "Show us your Moodle course!" forum.

*After you have resources and activities for them to review and assess.

Enable self-enrollment and make your course visible.



Consider...

- Editing enrollment settings to customize your course greeting.
- Adding a "Comments" block to solicit feedback on your course.
- Creating a forum to generate conversation and subscribing to it so you won't miss any posts.
